Siblings in Christ, on this Labor Day weekend, what is your prayer for those who labor?

We pray for those who struggle each week to pay their bills and pray even harder for the wealthy who do not care.

On this Labor Day, we pray with our neighbors, who are like the early church in the book of James.

We know that faith without justice is dead, and so we pray for justice to begin in our own spiritual lives. Come, let us worship the God of all who labor!

Reading of the Hebrew Scriptures Deuteronomy 4:1-2, 6-9 Joy Penticuff

So now, Israel, give heed to the statutes and ordinances that I am teaching you to observe, so that you may live to enter and occupy the land that the Lord, the God of your ancestors, is giving you. You must neither add anything to what I command you nor take away anything from it but keep the commandments of the Lord your God with which I am charging you.

You must observe them diligently, for this will show your wisdom and discernment to the peoples, who, when they hear all these statutes, will say, ‘Surely this great nation is a wise and discerning people!’ For what other great nation has a god so near to it as the Lord our God is whenever we call to God? And what other great nation has statutes and ordinances as just as this entire law that I am setting before you today? But take care and watch yourselves closely, so as neither to forget the things that your eyes have seen nor to let them slip from your mind all the days of your life; make them known to your children and your children’s children—

Reading of the Christian Scriptures James 1: 2-4, 9-11 Rev. Ginny

James, a servant of God and of the Lord Jesus Christ, to the twelve tribes in the Dispersion: Greetings. My brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of any kind, consider it nothing but joy, because you know that the testing of your faith produces endurance; and let endurance have its full effect, so that you may be mature and complete, lacking in nothing.

Let the believer who is lowly boast in being raised up, and the rich in being brought low, because the rich will disappear like a flower in the field. For the sun rises with its scorching heat and withers the field; its flower falls, and its beauty perishes. It is the same way with the rich; in the midst of a busy life, they will wither away.

This is the spirit of God’s love. **Thanks be to God.**
