Call to Worship

Friends and neighbors of the Congregational Church of Austin. As we continue our sermon series from the book of James we do so with the invitation: Come, if you are willing.

Come, if you are willing, but be prepared to find yourself sitting next to your worst enemy.

Come, if you are willing, but be prepared to find yourself offering prayer with someone whose values and way of life revolt you.

Come, if you are willing, but be prepared to find in yourself scary places and thoughts, that you would prefer to remain unacknowledged.

Come, if you are willing, but be prepared for an uncertainty that will not quickly be resolved, for a discomfort that will not easily be salved, for a hunger that will not willingly be satisfied.

Come, if you are willing, to this worship service where faith without justice is dead. Come, let us worship God!

Reading of the Hebrew Scriptures Proverbs 22:1-2, 8-9, 22-23 Michael Ross
A good name is to be chosen rather than great riches, and favor is better than silver or gold. The rich and the poor have this in common: the Lord is the maker of them all. Whoever sows injustice will reap calamity, and the rod of anger will fail. Those who are generous are blessed, for they share their bread with the poor. Do not rob the poor because they are poor, or crush the afflicted at the gate; for the Lord pleads their cause and despoils of life those who despoil them.

Reading of the Christian Scriptures James 2:14-26 Rev. Ginny
What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if you say you have faith but do not have works? Can faith save you? If a brother or sister is naked and lacks daily food, and one of you says to them, “Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill,” and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what is the good of that? So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead. But someone will say, “You have faith and I have works.” Show me your faith apart from your works, and I by my works will show you my faith. You believe that God is one; you do well. Even the demons believe—and shudder. Do you want to be shown, you senseless person, that faith apart from works is barren?

Was not our ancestor Abraham justified by works when he offered his son Isaac on the altar? You see that faith was active along with his works, and faith was brought to completion by the works. Thus the scripture was fulfilled that says, “Abraham believed God, and it was reckoned to him as righteousness,” and he was called the friend of God. You see that a person is justified by works and not by faith alone. Likewise, was not Rahab the prostitute also justified by works when she welcomed the messengers and sent them out by another road?

For just as the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without works is also dead. This is the spirit of God’s love. **Thanks be to God.**
