Good morning, friends of the Congregational Church of Austin. It's the first Sunday of the month, which means it's Communion Sunday.

That's right, Robert! And this is not just any Communion Sunday; today is World Communion Sunday!

World Communion Sunday? What does that mean – that all Christians are going to have a piece of bread in their hand at precisely the same time all over the world?

Not quite. It means that today we celebrate that the Body of Christ is not confined to one town, country, or even continent. We are all one in Jesus Christ!

So, Christians in Indonesia are connected to Christians in California and Christians in Germany are connected to Christians in Brazil through the elements of communion which unite us together?

That's right. So come let us celebrate the many languages, cultures, and communions of Jesus Christ!

Reading of the Hebrew Scriptures Job 1:1, 2:7-13 Rev. Ginny

There was once a man in the land of Uz whose name was Job. That man was blameless and upright, one who feared God and turned away from evil.

So Satan went out from the presence of the Lord, and inflicted loathsome sores on Job from the sole of his foot to the crown of his head. Job took a potsherd with which to scrape himself, and sat among the ashes.

Then his wife said to him, "Do you still persist in your integrity? Curse God, and die." But he said to her, "You speak as any foolish woman would speak. Shall we receive the good at the hand of God, and not receive the bad?" In all this Job did not sin with his lips.

Now when Job's three friends heard of all these troubles that had come upon him, each of them set out from his home—Eliphaz the Temanite, Bildad the Shuhite, and Zophar the Naamathite. They met together to go and console and comfort him. When they saw him from a distance, they did not recognize him, and they raised their voices and wept aloud; they tore their robes and threw dust in the air upon their heads. They sat with him on the ground seven days and seven nights, and no one spoke a word to him, for they saw that his suffering was very great.

Reading of the Christian Scriptures Galatians 3:26-29 Robert Currie
(Contemporary English Version)

All of you are God's children because of your faith in Christ Jesus. And when you were baptized, it was as though you had put on Christ in the same way you put on new clothes. Faith in Christ Jesus is what makes each of you equal with each other, whether you are a Jew or a Greek, a slave or a free person, a man or a woman. So, if you belong to Christ, you are now part of Abraham's family, and you will be given what God has promised.
